## **GOVERNMENT SOURCES OF ARTS FUNDING**

### **Local: New York City's Five Borough Arts Councils**

Each borough in New York City has an arts council that distributes city and state funding for local arts projects. Although the arts councils are all independent nonprofit organizations (not governmental agencies), this is the first place many artists and small arts groups go to secure public support for their projects. In addition to these funds, the arts councils each offer a range of artist services and programs.

NYSICA is a state agency that makes over 2500 grants each year to arts organizations in every arts discipline throughout the state. NYSICA's goal is to bring high-quality artistic programs to the citizens of the state through supporting the activities of nonprofit arts and cultural organizations. Its individual artists program provides grants to artists through a fiscal sponsor.

### **Regional: U.S. Regional Arts Organizations**

Partially funded by the National Endowment for the Arts, these organizations provide technical assistance to member state arts agencies, support and promote artists and arts organizations, and develop and manage arts initiatives on local, regional, national and international levels.

**Federal: National Endowment for the Arts**

The National Endowment for the Arts is a public agency dedicated to supporting excellence in the arts, both new and established; bringing the arts to all Americans; and providing leadership in arts education. Established by Congress in 1965 as an independent agency of the federal government, the Endowment is the nation's largest annual funder of the arts, bringing great art to all 50 states, including rural areas, inner cities, and military bases. The Endowment directly funds individuals in the area of literary arts.
