I. Artist Residencies and Colonies for Writers

Anderson Center Residency Program (Red Wing, Minnesota)

The Anderson Center offers two-week to one-month residencies from May through October to poets, fiction writers, and creative nonfiction writers on a 330-acre estate in <u>Red Wing, Minnesota</u>. Residents are provided with food, lodging, and studio space. Submit five copies of 10 pages of poetry or prose, a resumé, and a project proposal by February 1 for residencies during May, June, and July or by March 1 for residencies during August, September, and October. Only emerging writers who are residents of New York City or Minnesota may apply for a residency in August. www.andersoncenter.org

Atlantic Center for the Arts (New Smyrna Beach, FL) Atlantic Center for the Arts is an innovative nonprofit artists-in-residence community that provides artists with an opportunity to work and collaborate with some of the world's masters in the visual, literary, and performing arts. Located five miles from the Atlantic Ocean, Atlantic Center is situated on a lush 69-acre ecological preserve surrounded by protected wetlands. Through its own publications produced throughout the year, The Banff Centre supports contemporary art, literature, and criticism and explores the development of electronic platforms and new technologies in writing and publishing. Caldera (Sisters, Oregon) Caldera offers monthlong residencies to poets, fiction writers, and creative nonfiction writers from January through March each year. Located on 90 acres in the Central Cascades, 17 miles west of <u>Sisters, Oregon</u>, Caldera accommodates up to five residents at a time, each of whom receives a private cottage with sleeping loft, kitchenette, and work space. There is no residency fee, but writers are responsible for their own transportation, meals, and materials. Participation in a public outreach activity, such as giving a reading or facilitating a workshop, is encouraged of each resident. Submit 10 poems, one novel chapter, a short story, or an essay of up to 20 pages, a project description, a resumé, and two letters of reference with a \$30 application fee by June 15. <u>www.calderaarts.org</u>

Woodstock Byrdcliffe Guild (Woodstock, NY) Located in the Catskill Mountains, one-and-a-half miles from the center of Woodstock, New York; offers writers, visual artists and composers onemonth residencies from June through September. The cost per session is \$300. Writers under age 35, who need financial assistance, may apply for a \$100 scholarship from The Patterson Fund.

There are five artists in each session: one photographer, one poet, one prose writer, two painters, sculptors or other visual artists. The Colony is located in the heart of the beautiful Finger Lakes region of New York. The Summer Residency competition is statewide and is open to all NYS residents (including NYC). Previous Saltonstall Grant recipients and former residents are eligible to re-apply after four years.

Devils Tower National Monument Writer's Residency (Devils Tower, WY) Two one-week residencies will be available at the monument in September and October. Selected individuals will be offered modest housing at the monument. A \$100 travel stipend is provided by the Devils Tower Natural History Association. The goal of this residency is to provide an inspiring, secluded working environment for promising writers. Interested writers should submit writing samples to:

Djerassi Resident Artists Program (Woodside, CA) Residencies are awarded competitively, at no cost, to national and international artists in the disciplines of choreography, literature, music composition, visual arts, and media arts/new genres. We seek applications from emerging and mid-

career artists, for whom appointments as resident artists may make a significant difference to their careers, as well as from established artists with national and/or international reputations. Applicants are evaluated by panels of arts professionals in each category. Those selected are offered living and studio space for four to five week sessions during the season which runs from mid-March through mid-November. Residencies run from October 1 through May 1. Fellows have the opportunity to pursue their work independently in a diverse and supportive community. An historic fishing port, Provincetown is situated at the tip of Cape Cod in an area of spectacular natural beauty, surrounded by miles of dunes and National Seashore beaches. Headlands Center for the Arts (Sausalito, CA) Headlands Center for the Arts offers residencies of four to ten weeks to poets, fiction writers, and creative nonfiction writers from March to November. Residents are provided with a private room and work space and a shared kitchen, bathroom, and living room. Writers may apply alone or in pairs.
