EMERGENCY RELIEF GRANTS

The following is a selection of grants and emergency resources you can use to access financial assistance during periods of personal or professional emergency.

OPEN TO ALL DISCIPLINES

Alliance of Artists Communities (AAC) Residencies for Artists Affected by a Natural Disaster: When natural disasters occur, the AAC provides this database of immediate and short-term residencies for affected artists. The database is activated as-needed. AAC also offers emergency grants of up to \$1,000 to visual artists who are already admitted into their residency programs. http://www.artistcommunities.org/emergency-relief-programs

Change Inc.: One time emergency grants of up to \$1,000 for artists in all disciplines needing help with rent, medical expenses, utility bills, theft, fire damage, etc. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis and decisions may be announced within as little as one week.

American Guild of Variety Artists (AGVA) Sick & Relief Fund: Emergency aid to AGVA's current and previous members, including payments for bills and emergency grants.
