Main access route: FULTON St.

One of the best-kept secrets about Lower Manhattan is the little nook of restaurants tucked up north of the Seaport along Front Street, Although many of these small businesses were damaged during Sandy, some have come back and all deserve your patronage this summer. Since October, the businesses and buildings south of Frankfort Street. between the East River and Pearl Street, have been reopening. Between the newly redeveloped Pier 15 and the Seaport Museum's historic ships docked at Pier 16, the East River has become one of the best places to view New York Harbor, smell the salty air, and catch a performance. Follow Water Street south and discover the more than 35 plazas, arcades and other privatelyowned public spaces (or as the locals call them "POPS"). Touring these POPS you'll find everything from contemplative green spaces to dynamic art sculptures, as well as a few other secret gems we Downtowners like to keep to ourselves.

The west coast of Lower Manhattan is one of the island's treasures, and the adventurous trek across West Street is well worth it. Although the landfill beach has since been layered over with concrete, steel, glass and greenery, the area is still a haven for surprises of all sorts. From the culinary artisans embedded in and around North End Way, to the artworks lining the walls of the new Conrad New York, to the concerts that fill Nelson A. Rockefeller Park ("Rock Park") on summer evenings, the northern end of this side of Lower Manhattan can keep any visitor stimulated and full for an entire day. A trip down River Terrace takes you past Poets House and the Irish Hunger Memorial and if you continue south along the water, you'll come to Brookfield Place Plaza, nestled in the midst of North Cove with its backdrop of sailboats and sunsets.

Follow Broadway straight into southern most tip of Manhattan and you will find one of New York City's oldest public parks - The Battery. Over the past decade The Battery has experienced a radical transformation, thanks in large part to The Battery Conservancy's devoted efforts. Many of the City's historic and heritage museums are easily the park, accessible from including the Museum of Jewish Heritage, the Skyscraper Museum, the Smithsonian's Museum of the American Indian, and the Fraunces Tavern Museum, Just north of the park, past The Charging Bull, is where you'll also find a hot bed of restaurants and bars cradled in the historic Stone Street and beloved by many Lower Manhattan regulars. But trace the park's curvy tree-lined paths to the east and you will come upon its latest addition, the SeaGlass Carousel. Continue east past the refurbished South Ferry terminal and you will come to the Battery Maritime Building on South Street where you can take the ferry across the East River to the City's newest destination, Governors Island, a 172 acre park in the heart of New York Harbor, Accessible on weekends, this park provides artists and audiences with a unique setting for summer fun. Between The Battery, the museums, Stone Street, and Governors Island, this southern end of the district provides a peak into New York City's historic origins and very green future.

At the heart of Lower Manhattan is a rapidly rising set of stunning glass structures that have been quietly redefining New York City's skyline. At their base sits the 9/11 Memorial with its twin reflecting pools and the beginnings of the new World Trade Center Transportation Hub. Designed by Santiago Calatrava, this iconic Hub is still mostly an underground marvel for that engineering lover in all of us, but in 2015 it will be one of New York City's most spectacular destinations for fashion, dining and art as well as a central gateway into Lower Manhattan, Just a short walk from Tower One's rising spire, you can also find a few historic landmarks and sites for River To River activity including St. Paul's Chapel, Zuccotti Park, the New York Stock Exchange, City Hall Park, The Anne Frank Center USA, and the Museum of American Finance.

In addition to the guest artist line-up, I'll be participating in two evening events; one that is focused on music and the other stories. My hope is to bring the spirit of improvisation into these two evenings and try to work very much in the present time."
